



The Bahama Woodstar is a species of hummingbird that is only found in The Bahamas and Turks and Caicos islands. The male has a stunning iridescent purple throat and a forked tail. Both the male and female have greenish gold backs and orange sides on their bellies.

The Black-crowned Palm-Tanager is locally known as Cuatro Ojos ("four-eyes"). This striking bird is a medium-sized passerine endemic to the island of Hispaniola (Haiti and Dominican Republic). These birds are easily identified by their olive back contrasting with a gray nape and underparts, and a black head bearing a unique pattern of four white spots, hence its Spanish name.
