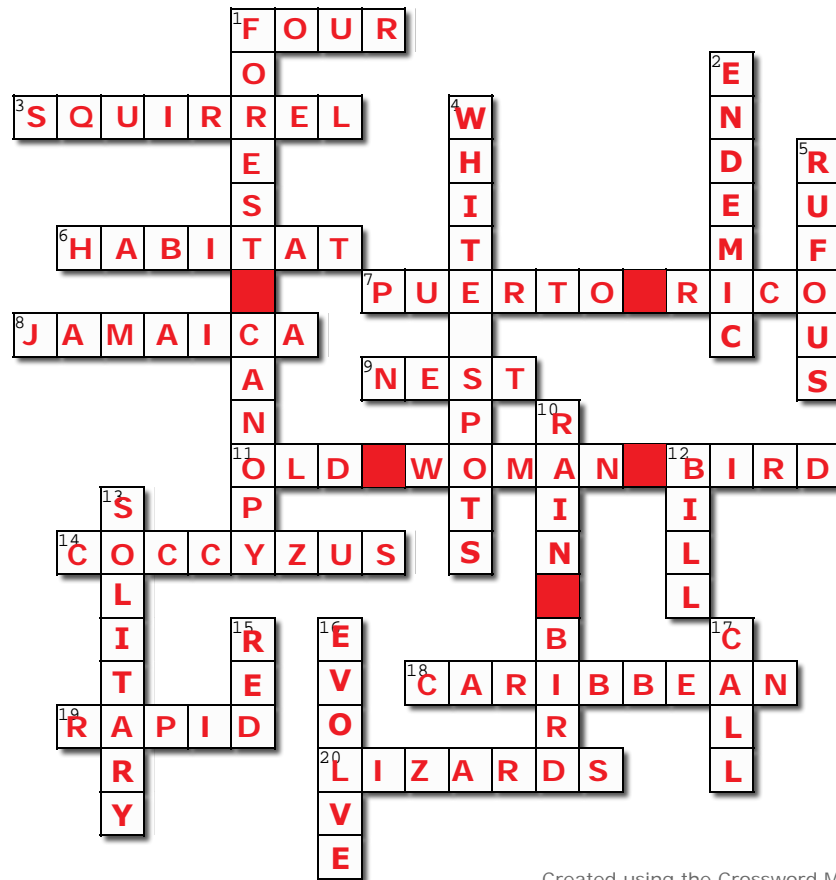


# jamaican Lizard-Cuckoo

## Across

- Number of species of Lizard-Cuckoo.
- Type of animal that Jamaican Lizard-Cuckoos can look like when running in tree branches.
- The name for the area where a plant or animal is naturally found, like forests.
- Another island that has its own endemic species of lizard-cuckoo (*two words with a space*).
- Country that the bird is endemic to.
- A structure or place that a bird uses for laying eggs and raising chicks.
- Local name for this bird in Jamaica (*three words with spaces*).
- Latin/scientific name for cuckoo.
- Region where all Lizard-Cuckoos are found.
- Adjective to describe the speed of the lizard-cuckoo's call.
- A favorite food for which the bird is named.

## Down

- Where they like to hunt and make their nests (*two words with a space*).
- A species found only in a particular place. For example, one island (like Jamaica) or a group of islands (like the Lesser Antilles).
- A distinctive marking on the tail of the Jamaican Lizard-Cuckoo (*two words with a space*).
- Color of the patch on primary wing feathers.
- The local name for lizard-cuckoos based on when they like to feed (*two words with a space*).
- Another name for the beak or mouth of a bird.
- Types of birds that don't like to hang out in flocks.
- Color of the ring surrounding the Jamaican Lizard-Cuckoo's eye.
- How lizard-cuckoos changed over time to prey upon an overabundance of lizards.
- Name for the sounds birds make, other than song.
