About this Bird

The Common Yellowthroat is greenish-brown above with a bright yellow throat and upper breast. The male has a black "bandit" mask while the female's face is brown. It breeds in most parts of Canada and the US. Those breeding in the colder north migrate to spend the winter in Central America and the Caribbean while those already in the warmer south may not migrate at all. These secretive birds can be found in grassy or brushy areas, usually near water. Listen for the distinctive call *schep*, which sounds like two stones rubbed together. *Bird Size 13 cm, 5 in.*
