





About this Bird

The Great Blue Heron is the Caribbean's largest heron with a two-metre wingspan. This blue-grey bird has a long 'S' shaped neck and a long, sharp yellow bill. It is found in the lowlands anywhere there is water. This shy handsome bird stands motionless in shallow water, striking at unsuspecting fish with a flash of its bill. It also eats crabs, amphibians, rodents and reptiles, swallowing its prey whole. This migratory bird can be found on most islands from October to April. Great Blue Herons live year-round on a few islands. Bird Size 117 cm, 46 in.
