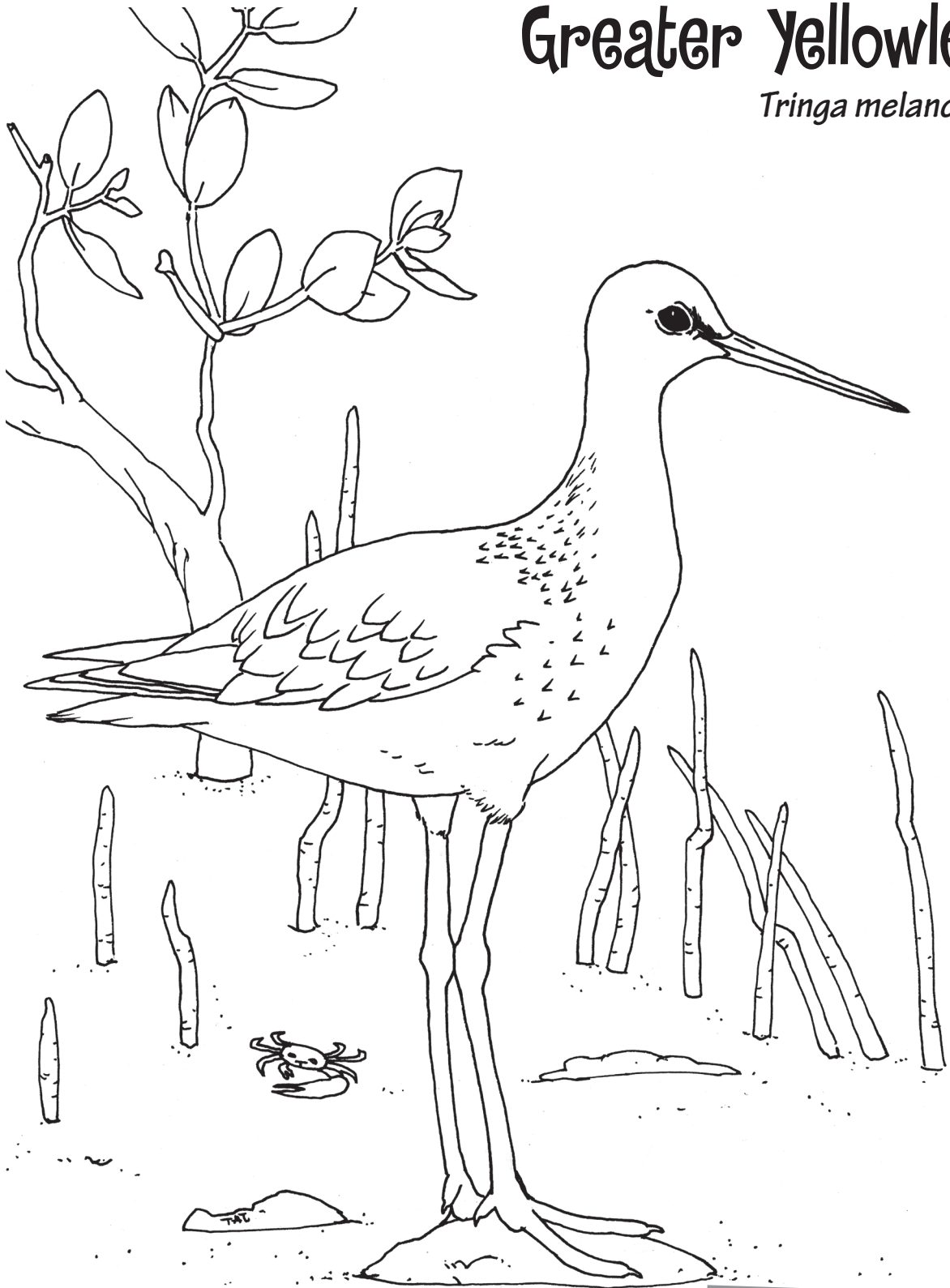


Greater Yellowlegs

About this Bird

The Greater Yellowlegs gets its name from its long, bright yellow legs. It wades through shallow water, swishing its long bill from side to side to stir up the water and feel for its prey. It catches fish, crabs, frogs and insects on mudflats, riverbanks and wetlands. This bird leaves its breeding grounds in Canada and flies to Central, South America and the Caribbean for the winter. It gives a loud high-pitched *tew, tew* call when alarmed. *Bird Size 36 cm, 14 in.*
