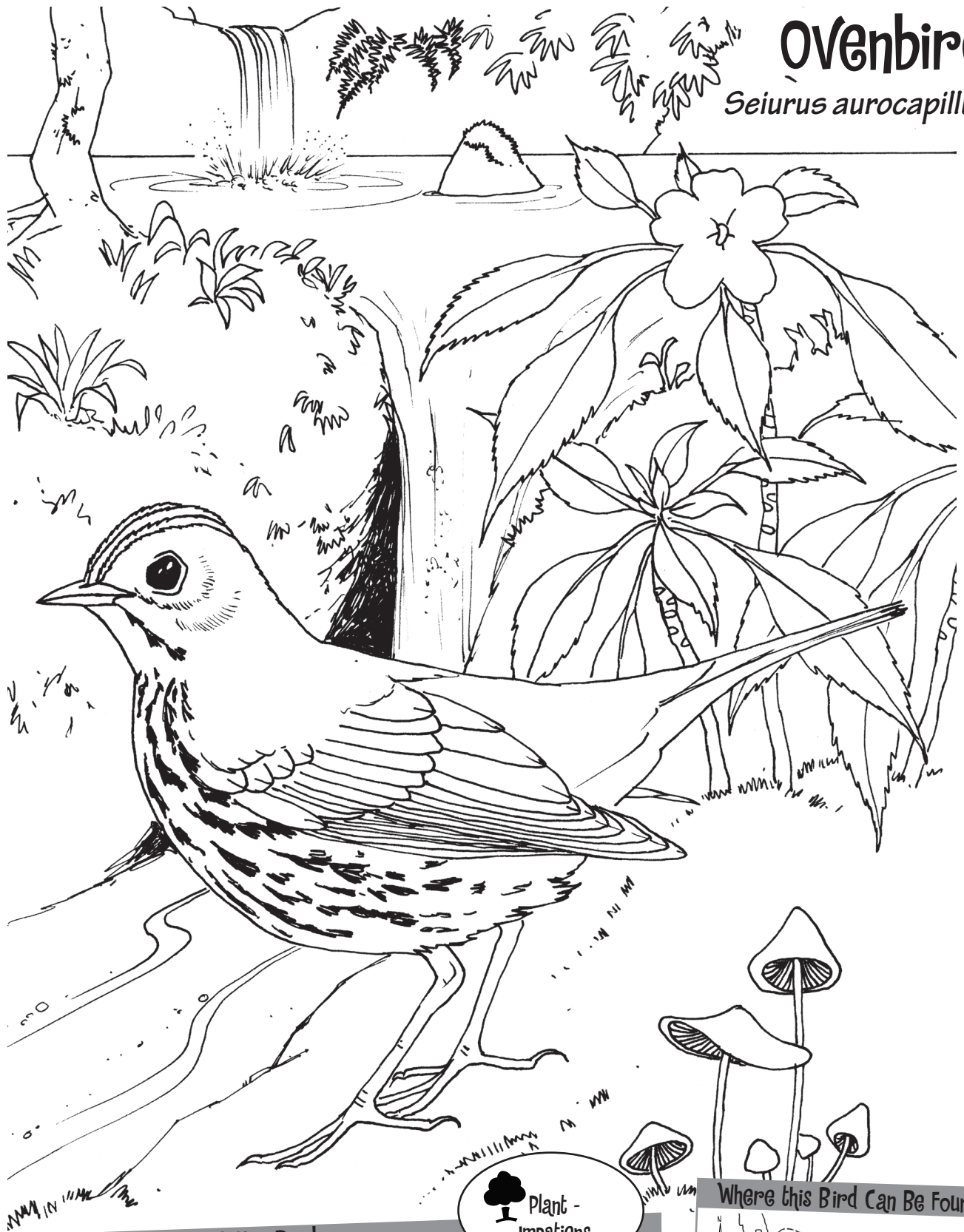


Ovenbird

About this Bird

Ovenbirds breed in eastern North America in summer and migrate south to the Caribbean for winter. These little warblers get their funny name because their dome-shaped nest, built on the ground, looks like a Dutch oven. Ovenbirds search for ants, beetles and other insects on the forest floor. They bob their heads and flick their tails when walking but their dull colours make them hard to spot. Look for their striped breast, bold white eye-ring, and orange crown stripe bordered by black on top of their head. Bird Size 15 cm, 6 in.
