

The Rose-Breasted Grosbeak has a heavy, white, cone-shaped bill made for cracking seeds and eating berries but it also eats insects. The male has a striking rosy-red triangle on its breast, a black head and back, white belly, and big white spots on its wings. The female is brown with a boldly striped head, streaked breast and two white wing bars. Rose-Breasted Grosbeaks breed in Canada and north-eastern US and migrate south to spend the winter in Central America, the Caribbean and some parts of South America. They can be seen in woodlands, forest edges, parks and gardens. *Bird Size 20 cm, 8 in.*
