

BELTED KINGFISHER (Megaceryle alcyon)



• The Belted Kingfisher breeds locally in suitable habitat in the United States and Canada. They require earthen banks so that they can dig out a burrow to nest in.

• During winter many of the northern breeding Belted Kingfishers migrate south as far as northern South America.





• Because they live along the banks of waterways, Belted Kingfishers may become entangled in plastic pollutants such as discarded fishing gear.
