

CARIBBEAN SEA

The Cape May Warbler has greenish upperparts, yellow underparts streaked with black, and a yellow face with red-brown cheek patches. Its thin bill is good for catching insects and caterpillars. The Cape May Warbler is the only warbler that has a curled, straw-like tongue. It uses this to drink nectar which it only feeds on in the Caribbean where it spends the winter. This warbler can be found anywhere plants are flowering and fruiting, including forests, coastal thickets, mangroves, shade coffee plantations, gardens and backyards. Bird Size 12.5 cm, 5 in.
